

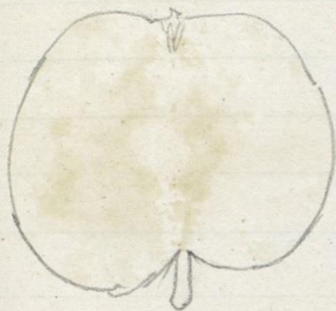

Fruit middle sized,
cylindrical, flattened at the
ends. Eye in a ^{wide} shallow
depression the sides of which
are evenly formed

Foot stalk short inserted
in a moderate sized cavity
Skin yellow, sometimes
mixed with a slight tinge of
brown on the side next the
sun, interspersed throughout
with pale dots.

Flesh whitish juicy sweet
firm, and very good without
any perfume.

Shoots light yellowish brown
Leaves oblong acuminate
somewhat cordate at base
doubly serrated, ~~in little fold~~
Petioles short, strong and erect
Stipules above middle size
lanceolate.

1 Skin yellow on the unexposed
part; the side next the sun
is washed with bright
reddish brown which gradually
fades towards the shaded side

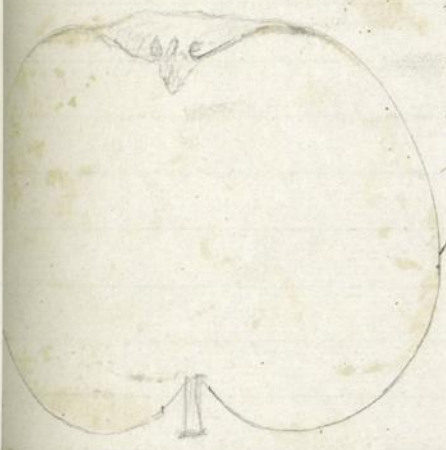

Fruit above middle sized, inclining to oblong, broadest near the base, the outline tolerably round. Eye large deep in an evenly formed hollow very little pitted. Footstalk scarcely half an inch in length, of middling thickness inserted in a regular and moderate sized cavity. The Skin is smooth, pale orange yellow generally washed with red next the Sun and faintly streaked.



Flesh yellowish white firm, breaking very sweet and juicy and high flavoured.

In perfection from Oct. till January — a good bearer.

Shoots vigorous, dark chestnut brown with few spots.

Leaves middle sized, ovate, acuminate regularly ~~not~~ not deeply serrated.

Petioles short; Stipules linear-lanceolate, more than half the length of the Petioles.

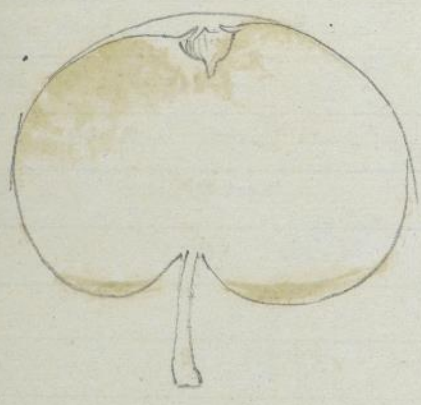
Flowers Middle sized, petals roundish oval, somewhat ciliate at the base.

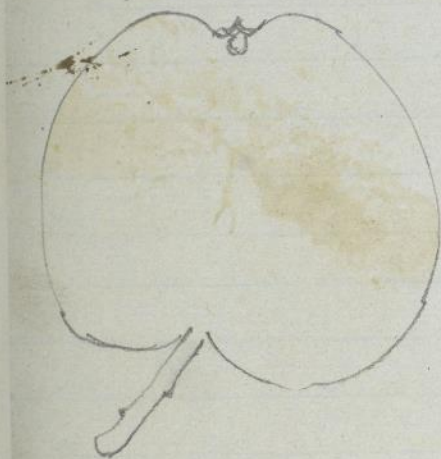

Fruit middle sized roundish
oblong tapering a little to the
eye which is small, ^{clear} and ^{very}
little depressed. The footstalk
is long moderately thick, ^{downy} and
rather deeply inserted. The
skin is smooth, yellow, tinged
with green, and much speckled
with pale spots. Skin an
unusually large. Flesh bright
yellow, hard, juicy, tough with
very little flavor.

Shoots rather thickly woody
beneath which they are of
a dark chestnut red. Leaves
middle sized ovate acuminate
cordate at the base doubly and
serrated. Petioles strong, rather
short. Stipules middle sized.

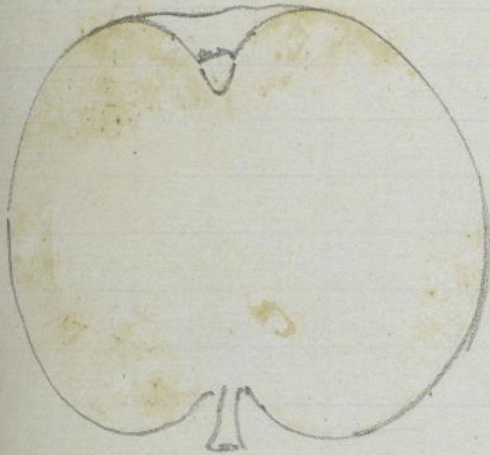

The wood and leaves
are also diff from that
of Reineette rouge O 717.

I should think this is not
the true R. rouge, but
rather the R. rouge pi-
quet of the Gard. Fr. p. 325.

The fruit of this is large
in shape and colour
resembling a Royal
Pearmain — but the
stalk differs in being
inserted freely without
a knob or part of the
fruit projecting upon
it.

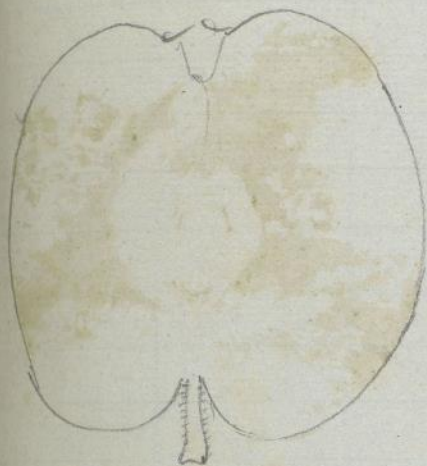

Fruit large, rather oblong and somewhat angular. The eye moderately large & deep, surrounded by unequal plaits, the largest being the terminations of the principal ribs. The foot stalk is short deeply inserted in a contracted, acute and angular cavity. The skin is tolerably smooth, pale green on the shaded side sprinkled with small whitish dots. next the sun it is streaked and bright red. Thick yellow hair, sunb, purple. Not of high quality.

Shoots of a brownish colour sprinkled with a few small oblong whitish specks. Leaves very large roundish oblong, very shortly acuminate, cordate at the base, crenated. pale green above, & rather thickly woolly beneath. Petioles of medium length, strong. Stipules small, linear embracing the shoot.
