

WRITING YOUR REPORT

Use this list in Weeks 6-8 to ensure that your report is on the right track and contains everything the assessors need to see.

Give your report to your teacher at the end of week 8. Your teacher will send it to your RHS Community Outreach Advisor so they and your assessors can look at it ahead of the celebration event. **Important! You will need to bring one printed copy with you to the celebration event.**

WHAT TO INCLUDE IN YOUR PROJECT REPORT:

A FRONT COVER

This should include your team name, school name and the date of your celebration event, as well as the region your team is from.

WHAT'S THE BIG IDEA?

Which brief did you decide to follow? Sum up the concept behind your garden in a short paragraph. Why did you choose this idea?

TELL US ABOUT YOUR TEAM

Introduce your team members, including your teacher and your mentor. Everyone in the team should include their name, age (well, maybe just the students!), and their role in the project. Each person should tell us what their favourite part of Green Plan It has been and why.

DEVELOPING YOUR PROJECT

Tell us what research your team carried out and how you developed or discounted your ideas.

PEOPLE POWER

Who is the target audience for your garden and how does the space benefit them? What did you discover about your audience and how does your design reflect their needs and ideas? What worked in your design? Was there anything you had to change?

TOP PLANTS

As a team, pick three plants you want to include in your garden design and explain why they were chosen.

PROJECT REVIEW

Include a short paragraph from each team member sharing what you have learned as individuals from being involved in the project. This could include new skills developed or knowledge gained, or any future gardening aspirations. Is there anything that you would do differently if you did the project again?
